

Dear D51 Families and Colleagues,

We had another exciting week in District 51. Last weekend, my family and I were able to enjoy watching our amazing students perform in extracurricular activities. Saturday, we attended a great theater performance by the award winning Central High School theater team under the direction of Ms. Meltzer. Shoutout to the CHS theater students, and shoutout to the families and community who came out to support them.

On Sunday, we drove out to Glenwood Springs to watch the Grand Valley Youth Cycling high school teams from D51 race in the high school mountain bike state championships. Our D51 students competed hard, and I'm proud of all their efforts. We had many D51 student athletes qualify for state and compete in the individual and team competitions. The Grand Junction High School team finished on the podium in 3rd. We had TOP 10 finishes from Alma McGowan (3rd) and Beck Sharp (8th) in the Sophomore Girls race, Riley Grimes (6th) in the JV Boys race, and Ben Garmany (7th) in the Varsity Boys race. I've also enjoyed getting to visit schools and present them with their Performance School banners. We had over two-thirds of our D51 schools earn the highest academic rating in the state as Performance Schools, and I'm so proud of the students and staff who worked hard to earn those ratings. Tuesday I visited Mount Garfield Middle School and Appleton Elementary School to present them with their banners. MGMS not only received the Performance rating, but they also jumped two levels from Priority Improvement to Performance in one year! And Appleton continued its tradition of earning the highest rating in the state, with this being their 14th year in a row! Wednesday I visited Chipeta Elementary School to present them with their Performance School banner. Chipeta has been a Performance School two years in a row, and was a Governor's Bright Spot Award winner for math growth last year! Thursday I visited Shelledy Elementary School and Independence Academy Charter School to present them with their Performance School banners. Not only did they both move from Improvement to Performance, but Shelledy grew 15 points and IACS grew over 14 points on their School Performance Frameworks! Today I got to visit Redlands Middle School, Scenic Elementary School, and STEAM@Tope Elementary School to present them with their Performance School banners. RMS has been a Performance School for 14 years in a row, and they scored the highest on their SPF out of all D51 middle schools! Scenic Elementary has also been a Performance School for 14 years in a row, and they scored the highest on their SPF (97.7) out of ALL D51 schools! And STEAM@Tope received the Performance School rating for the sixth year in a row, continuing their tradition of excellence! Congrats to Principals Bagwell, Hafey, Chiaro, Kidd, Gonsalves, Davis, Scott, and Bollinger for your leadership. And, shoutout to all of the students, staff, and families at these schools for your hard work. I look forward to getting out to the rest of our Performance Schools soon to celebrate their success.

Lastly, I had a couple of opportunities this week to share about the great things happening in D51 to different stakeholder groups, as well. On Tuesday night, we continued our public tours of the new GJHS building with families and community members who helped donate and support the YES on GJHS bond campaign in 2021. It was a great opportunity to highlight the work happening at the new GJHS site and to talk about the opportunities our students, staff, and families will soon have in this 21st-century learning environment. Thanks to Dr. Christensen from the D51 Foundation for organizing these opportunities. We can't wait for the entire community to see the finished product, soon. And, on Wednesday, I had the opportunity to present to the 2nd Leadership D51 cohort. These are community leaders who have committed to attending classes over this school year to learn more about the district and help spread the word about the ins and outs of our D51 community. I enjoy opportunities like these to be able to highlight the great work happening across our district, and to better educate the community on the Focus Areas and goals within our 3 year community-driven Strategic Plan.

As we finish the month of October, and head into November, I want to thank each of you for all that you do. Thank you for your support, and thank you for believing in public education in the Grand Valley. It's an honor to serve this community, and we thank you for being a part of the D51 Family.
