Housing Survey

W-2 Online Option

It's W-2 season, and the Finance Department is working hard on getting 2023 W-2s to you as quickly as possible. To speed up the process, you can choose to opt out of paper delivery of your W-2 form and receive it electronically. This will allow you to access your W-2 as soon as they are posted without having to wait for the delivery of the paper form. In addition, you will help us reduce the costs associated with purchasing paper forms, stuffing envelopes, and distributing the W-2s to schools. If you opted-out of paper forms last year, you do not have to opt-out again.
