

Dear D51 Colleagues and Families,

This week has been filled with celebrations as we took the time to recognize some of the amazing individuals who help our district run successfully. From our dedicated Assistant Principals who provide daily support and guidance to our students and staff, to our hardworking Librarians who foster a love for reading and learning in our school communities, and our Paraprofessionals who play a vital role in ensuring the success and well-being of our students every day. This week, I started the final meetings of the year with my Superintendent Student Advisory Groups. Meeting with these groups, made up of students from each of our comprehensive high schools and R-5 High School, provides an opportunity for me to hear directly from students and gather valuable feedback from the student perspective. I met with my GJHS group yesterday, and we continued the conversation that I started with them the last time we met on technology use in schools and the impact phones and social media are having on students their age and younger. I was able to gain even more insight from them, and I look forward to hearing from my other Superintendent Student Advisory Groups in the weeks to come. This topic of tech and social media use in schools is one that I have mentioned in past letters, and it is one that we are seriously exploring as a district. We have been in a data gathering phase for the last couple of months, and now we are moving to an action phase that will have positive impacts on the school experience in D51 starting next school year. The next step will be to update our district policy on this topic, which hasn't been updated in 14 years. From there, we'll begin communicating out changes in the policy, what that will mean for our schools starting in the 2024-25 school year, and why we are looking to make necessary changes in policy and procedures.

Know that, whatever changes we make, the goal will be to better create sustained access to attention-fostering spaces and build spaces that maximize learning and thriving in our schools. Some schools have already started implementing and piloting changes in their buildings when it comes to tech use, and they are seeing great results. The limited hours that we have with your students during the school day are so valuable, and we want to keep them focused on teaching and learning and remove any barriers that impede student success...academically, socially, and emotionally. As we progress through the next steps on this topic, we will keep you updated, and I ask that you join us in ensuring our schools are spaces that maximize learning and thriving, as well. Together, we will be able to make a real impact on the lives of our students, and doing so in partnership will reinforce the importance of this work. More to come on this topic soon.
